Protection and Advocacy for Persons with Developmental Disabilities (PADD) provides legal

assistance and advocacy services to individuals

with developmental disabilities.

Protection and Advocacy for Individuals with Mental Illness (PAIMI) provides legal assistance and advocacy services to individuals with mental illness who receive mental health services and who live in residential treatment facilities and in the community.

Protection and Advocacy for Individual Rights (PAIR) provides legal assistance and advocacy services to individuals with severe disabilities not eligible for other federally funded protection and advocacy services.

The Client Assistance Program (CAP) assists individuals with disabilities who are seeking services from federally funded rehabilitation programs.

Protection and Advocacy for Beneficiaries of Social Security (PABSS) provides education and training on employment and Social Security Work Incentives, and provides assistance to SSDI and SSI beneficiaries with vocational rehabilitation, employment, and other support services.

Protection and Advocacy for Individuals with Traumatic Brain Injury (PATBI) provides legal assistance and advocacy services to individuals with head injuries.

Protection and Advocacy for Voter Access (PAVA) ensures that every qualified individual with a disability has the opportunity to vote on Election Day.

Protection and Advocacy for Assistive
Technology (PAAT) provides legal and non-legal
advocacy services to individuals with disabilities
who are seeking access to assistive technology
devices and services.
